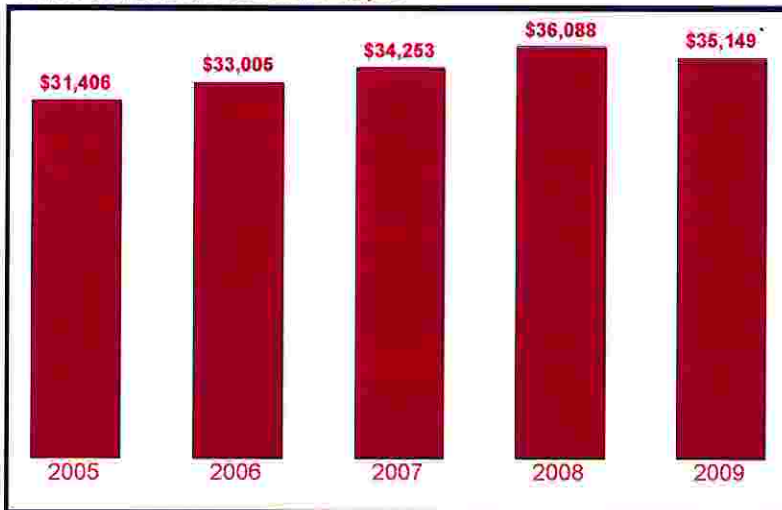

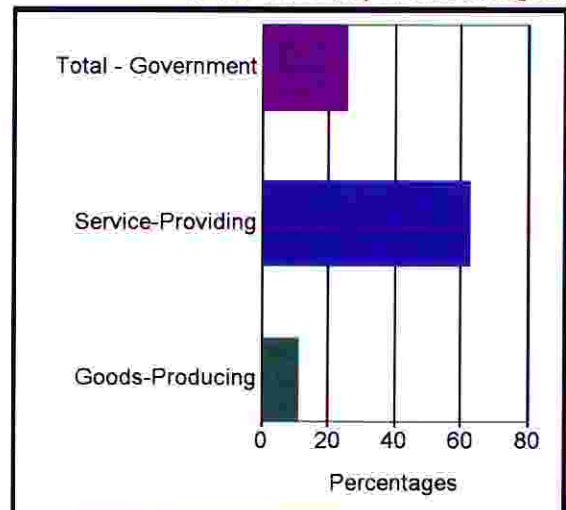
**Brunswick, GA Per Capita Income**

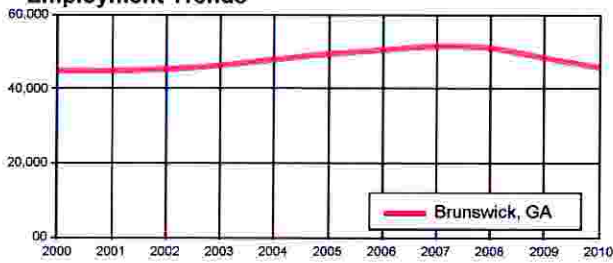

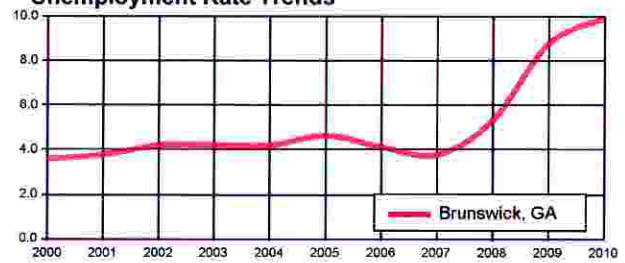

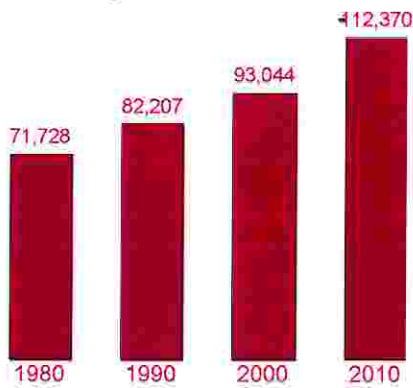
**Employment Trends**
