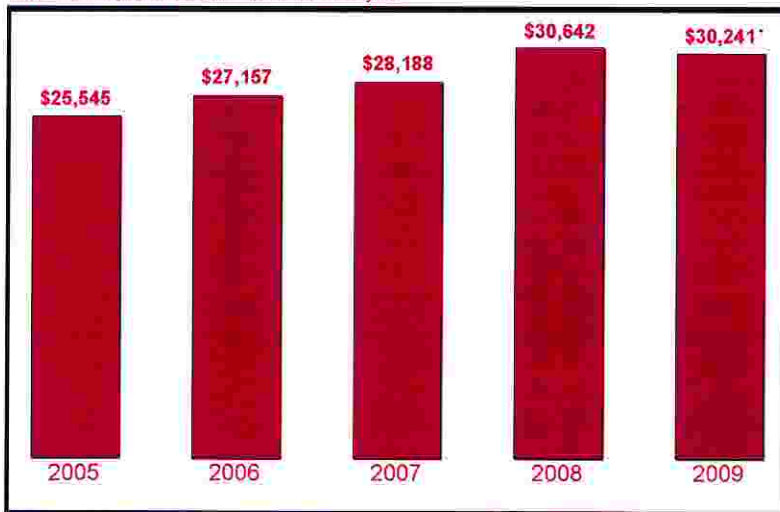

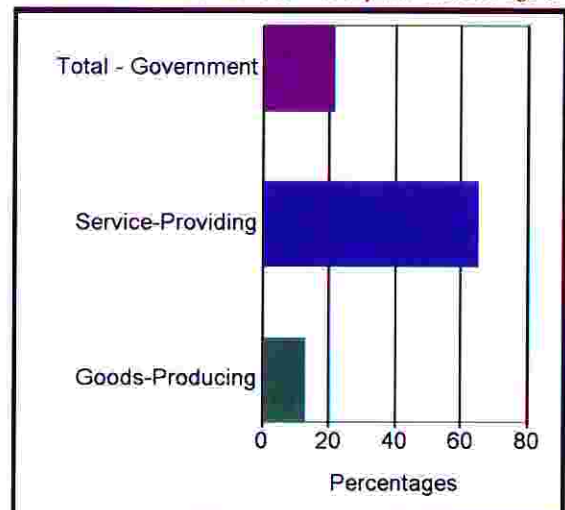
Coastal Georgia RC Per Capita Income

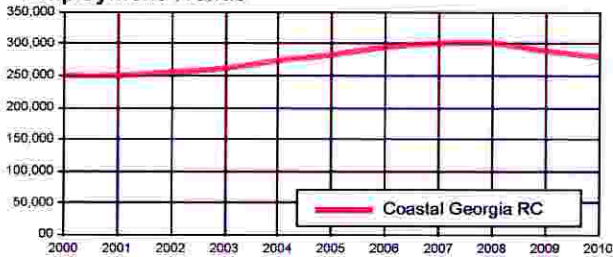

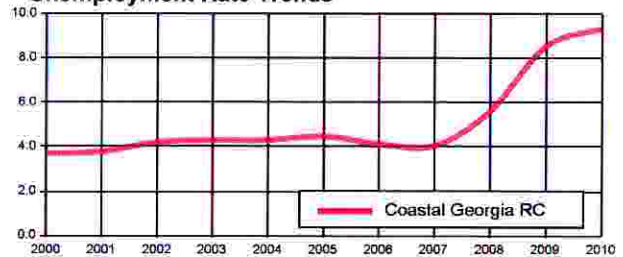

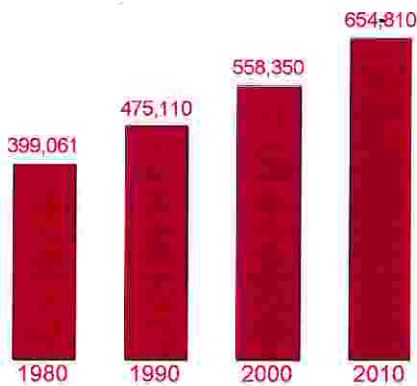
Employment Trends
